UBS Wearing of Respiratory Protective Equipment (RPE) Policy

This policy applies to all University Biomedical Services (UBS) staff working with laboratory animals.

For health, safety and wellbeing reasons a risk based approach is taken to minimise the exposure of UBS staff to laboratory animal allergens (LAAs). RPE must be worn where the risk assessment identifies there is a reasonable risk of exposure which cannot be controlled by local exhaust ventilation (LEV) and/or other control measures. It is reasonably foreseeable that 'open cage work' activities pose the greatest risk of exposure and therefore RPE must be worn. These high risk activities include but are not limited to: all work in 'conventional' caging type areas, individual ventilated cage (IVC) changing, fur clipping, cage scraping or washing, waste disposal and cleaning or maintenance of any filters or ventilated extract systems (such as cage change stations and IVC air handling units).

Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and associated safety documents must be adhered to when working with laboratory animals. These contain instruction and guidance on the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) and RPE that must be worn for the activity described. As a minimum this policy must be adhered to for the wearing of RPE when working with laboratory animals in a UBS Biofacility.

A risk assessment may identify exemptions to wearing RPE, for example when working with certain species such as fish and large farm animals or in the course of some activities such as during surgery. However, these exemptions must be risk assessed, recorded and agreed with the appropriate UBS Biofacility Manager.

The University Allergy to Animals Policy and Guidance states that a minimum of RPE class FFP2 facemasks must be used. UBS offers a variety of disposable class FFP2 and FFP3 facemasks suited to different face shapes. When a local risk assessment and/or face fit test identifies that a disposable facemask is not suitable, for example due to facial hair that prevents a proper seal of the mask to the face, or where a task is very physical in nature or the environment is hot/uncomfortable, then the UBS staff member will be provided with powered RPE and trained in its safe use. A face fit test is not required for powered RPE.

All applicable UBS staff working in Biofacilities will have been offered a disposable RPE quantitative face fit test. New staff are face fitted as part of their induction process. Powered RPE may be selected in preference to a face fit test for disposable RPE by a UBS staff member. Once made, this choice must be sustained. Exceptional circumstances for changing from powered to disposable RPE must be discussed with the Biofacility Manager and a face fit test undertaken.

As part of the induction process Occupational Health provide information regarding RPE. If increased risk of sensitivity to LAAs is identified Occupational Health will provide specific RPE advice (such as wearing a class FFP3 facemask as a minimum) and/or enhanced monitoring of an individual. Such advice must be discussed with the appropriate Biofacility Manager and adhered to.

Policy Expectations

The following must be adhered to:

Disposable RPE

If a face fit test is passed for a particular facemask type this model must be worn as required by risk assessment for an activity. Fitting instructions are given at the face fit test and are available on the packaging of the mask. Further guidance and information on fitting and wearing disposable RPE is provided in UBS Biofacilities on posters and by the Biofacility Manager.

Once fitted, the facemask must be secured in place for the complete duration of the activity. Facemasks should be appropriately fitted and maintained for a session or working shift as per the manufacturer instructions and then disposed of correctly. During breaks in use, if safe to reuse, disposable RPE must be stored carefully and correctly to maintain their cleanliness and effectiveness.

Where the appropriate disposable facemask is temporarily unavailable the Biofacility Manager must be consulted to determine what alternative RPE is suitable and what work can be undertaken.

Powered RPE

Powered RPE comes in a variety of model designs and options. However the principles are the same for each. Once fitted and operating, powered RPE must be secured in place for the complete duration of an activity.

To ensure that the equipment is in good working order, prior to and after use, powered RPE must be appropriately inspected, cleaned and maintained. This must be carried out and recorded as per the local Biofacility systems. This will include checks for clear vision, battery level, filter condition and efficient airflow. Manufacturer instructions provide details on how to undertake the checks required for specific models. The UBS Biofacility Manager will provide powered RPE record sheets and will ensure they are correctly completed.

When not in use powered RPE must be stored carefully and properly so as to be clean and ready for the next operational period.
