### 7. Standard Condition 18 Reports

(a)

The committee reviewed 6 reports covering the period from 28<sup>th</sup> March – 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2019 and recommended the following:

- Implementation of a monitoring system to determine whether there is an elevated rate of unexpected death in the NSG line
- Increased monitoring and establishing disease progression through blood tests, if NSGs are needed to be kept for an extended period of time
- The establishment of a leukaemia score sheet would help monitoring disease progression as well

(b)

The committee reviewed 5 reports covering the period from 20<sup>th</sup> February – 15<sup>th</sup> May 2019 and recommended the following:

- The establishment of a bleeding baseline and use as a monitoring system
- Analyse the times of death proposedly from onset of leukaemia and bleed more frequently in times that death is more likely
- The use of a leukaemia score sheet to determine onset of disease
