a) What is happening with animals in your unit? There has been no change in the number of marmosets in and breeding will be reviewed soon as a new grant has come through. There is a small rodent study in the imaging suite, and a rat study will be starting within the next couple of months. A researcher at that was due to retire has now applied for another grant.
fish numbers are increasing. There have been three birds found dead at the due to bacterial enteritis. Steps have been put in place to prevent the spread. There will be some work staring at the beginning of next year with 24 magpies. The have requested to do some work with zebra finches.
There has been a 50% reduction of frogs being used, so these will be rehomed rather than culled. The medaka have been rehomed with a member of staff. is going to be opening soon making five facilities that house fish and frogs.
Quarantine processes are changing to comply with the new Cefas (Centre for Environment, Fisheries and Aquaculture Science) rules. 150 fish need to be screened for import which is a much larger number than is usually imported. So, if 50 fish are needed, 200 will be ordered. 150 of those will be screened and culled. This goes against the 3Rs, so UK facilities are looking within the UK for fish, rather than importing. A resource between UK managers has been set up to enable sharing of fish stocks.
There have been recent publications showing that a much lower stocking density than we currently use, is beneficial to zebra fish. So trials will be conducted, then findings will be discussed with the users. Zebra fish in two facilities have had their food increased and water quality has not been compromised by this.
is applying for a service licence mainly because of the Cefas rules as we are hoping to provide an import service for other facilities in the UK.
Frogs are not being put in an incubator after injections, and food is not being withheld, due to review of the licences.
New lamprey will be arriving soon.
b) What is happening with staff in your unit? are fully staffed.
are fully staffed across all five sites. They will be attending and presenting at the first UK zebrafish meeting in September and there will be a second NACWO.
There have been lots of tours and staff are eager to continue to show people around.
